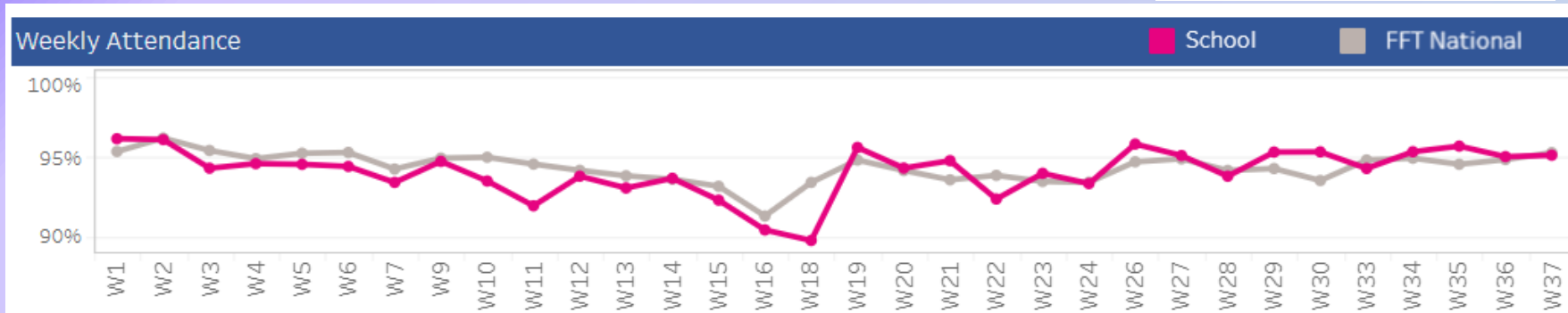
Pupils learn how to keep themselves safe.

- Ask them about their day and praise and encourage their achievements at school.
- If you have concerns discuss them with your child's teacher.
- Be willing to engage with any support offered by the school.
- If your child is ill or absent for any other reason, contact the school on the first day of absence.

Leave your bags outside the school before 9am - They accept Clothing, Paired shoes, Hats, Bags, Household Linen, Curtains, Towels or Bedding (sheets, pillowcases & duvet covers) and soft toys and for every kg donated, the school earns £0.40 (raising more than £200 last year!)

Free School Meals

If you apply and qualify for Free School Meals, your child's school will receive additional funding called Pupil Premium, **up to £1,320 a year**.

Even though all children in Key Stage 1 receive Universal Infant Free School Meals, your child's school can only benefit from Pupil Premium funding if you apply, and are eligible, for Free School Meals. Don't delay the funding... apply today!

Schools spend the pupil premium money on anything that can help your children do well at school, including trips, activities and extra support.

Applying online only takes a few minutes and, if eligible, your child will continue to receive Free School Meals until:

- The end of Year 6 (if they are in primary school on
- The end of Year 11 (if they are in secondary school on

This is even if your income rises above the threshold at any point during that time.

Eligibility

To get free school meals you need to be receiving one of the following:

- Universal Credit (up to £7,400 net earned income)
- Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop working altogether or start to work less than 16 hours per week)
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,100
