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
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2nd May Summer Term 2025 Letter 2

Mobile Phones

We would like to clarify the rules around the use of mobile phones in school.

Only children in Year 6 are permitted to bring their phones in with certain safeguards in place:

- the children will not be allowed to have their mobile phones during the school day in the classroom under any circumstances;
- the phone must be switched off and left in the child's bag;
- children are not allowed to take photographs or videos of other children or staff in school;
- children are not allowed on their phone until they have left the school premises.



Children younger than Year 6 should not be bringing mobile phones to school unless there are exceptional circumstances which must be put in writing to the Headteacher. If children are found to be using phones on school premises they will be confiscated and parents will be required to collect them from the school office.

Phones must not be used anywhere within the school building or around children on the grounds before and after school. This is part of our safeguarding duty.

Parent Webinars - County Lines And Criminal Exploitation



The sessions will share what criminal exploitation is, with a focus on county lines and explore how to spot signs that it may be happening to your child or a child you know. They will also cover trends in the local area and where to get advice and support if you are concerned.
