## 'Meet the Teacher' Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July

We have our 'Meet the Teacher' session after school. This is an opportunity where you are welcome to come and meet your child's new teacher in their new classroom and it starts straight after school until 4.00pm

# Open Afternoon Monday 8<sup>th</sup> July

This is our Open Afternoon and this starts straight after school until 4.15pm. This is an opportunity for you to come into school to view some of your child's work from across the year and also to collect their Annual Report which will include results of any statutory assessments, including Y1 Phonics and Y4 Multiplication Check. Y6 SATs results will not be available as they are not being released until after this date so we will make sure that they get sent home as soon as possible.

Please note that this is not the time to discuss matters with the teachers and reports should not be opened until you are at home. Any reports not collected will be posted home.

## Earrings

If you plan to have your child's ears pierced, it would be helpful for this to take place at the start of the summer holiday so that the time is available before earrings can be removed. Our policy on the wearing of earrings during PE is as follows:

In line with many other schools our policy means that it is not acceptable to use tape to cover earrings. This applies in both PE lessons and at any clubs. We would therefore advise that children leave any earrings at home on their PE day. Any child who cannot remove their studs will be given another task to complete during the lesson. Whenever possible children should be able to remove their own jewellery before a PE lesson.

## Uniform

Although we are getting near the end of term we are writing to remind you that we are a 'school uniform' school and expect all children to come to school dressed appropriately.

Children should not wear any make up or accessories, including jewellery (bracelets, necklaces). They may wear watches and stud earrings only and they will be asked to remove anything unsuitable. If they continue to wear these items then parents will be asked to come and collect the items.

So that you can prepare for next term here are reminders about school unform expectations:

- Sweatshirts navy (with or without school logo)
- Polo shirts white or navy







- Trousers / shorts grey, black or navy (trousers may be worn by boys and girls)
- Skirts / pinafores grey, black or navy
- Socks / tights white, grey, navy or black
- Summer Dress navy and white checked, or striped, summer dresses
- Footwear should be sensible black, flat shoes (high heels, boots or boot style trainers are not permitted)

#### PE kits:

- White /blue round-necked T-shirt (football tops must not be worn). Ideally, these should be plain with no logos.
- Blue/black shorts that are appropriate for PE.
- For outdoors school sweatshirts (no hoodies) and dark blue/black jogging trousers should be worn. Ideally, these should be plain with no logos.
- Pierced earrings must be removed for PE and long hair must be tied back for PE and games

## Please remember that all clothes should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

## **Reading Books and Library Books**

Please can any books be returned by the following days so that the libraries be sorted.

- Reception reading books to be returned by 12<sup>th</sup> July.
- KS1 reading books and Reading Diaries to be returned by 12<sup>th</sup> July.
- All KS2 Library books be returned by Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> July.
