Thank you all for sharing the first 40 days of this school year with me. That is 21% of the school year completed already and only 61 days until Christmas!


Have a great half-term break, you all deserve it!

Pokemon Cup Tuesday 21st October



Please ensure your submit your vote for your preferred candidate for our Parent Governor elections. You should have received a paper voting form and envelopes for returning your ballot.

Guidance for returning your vote.

- When you have chosen your preferred candidate, please fold the ballot paper.
- Do not write your name on the ballot paper.
- Return ballot papers using a double envelope system.
- The ballot paper should be sealed in an inner unmarked envelope, which is then sealed within an outer envelope with the name of the voter printed on the back.
- Ballot papers may be returned via a pupil, by post or by the voter in person.
- A ballot box will be available between 8.30 am and 3.30pm each day in the school office.
- All ballot papers must be received by 3.30pm on Wednesday 5th November 2025.
- Ballot papers received after this date, for whatever reason, will not be counted.
