#### **Parent Governor Elections**

Please look out for further details in the next few weeks as we look for new Parent Governors to join us. Governors play a key role in the success of our school, for the benefit of our children. They are volunteers who work with the professional

staff to ensure our children get the best education the school can provide and are a mix of parent governors, co-opted governors from the wider community, a governor from our Local Authority, a staff governor and our Head Teacher.

Governors set the strategic direction for the school and monitor progress on all aspects of school life, from safeguarding and wellbeing to educational outcomes, resources and school values.

#### PTA News

<u>With the AGM looming, we need some new committee members</u>! In particular we are in a need of a treasurer (as we cannot legally function as an organisation without one) and some wider committee members to help with planning/organising individual events or initiatives. Without some new members we will not be able to provide many of the events such as Cake Fridays, Discos and the Summer Fayre which setting aside raising money we know so many of the children look forward to.

As a few examples, might you be able to help with one of the following?

- **Raffle** could you coordinate/help source prizes for our popular raffles? These raise a lot of money each year so it would be a shame to lose them but it is a big task as given the economic climate, companies do need encouraging to supply prizes
- **Cake Fridays** only 3 Fridays a year and we have the organisation well mapped out now so it's an easy one to pick up if you are new to PTA events
- **Christmas Gifts** the teachers already have the packs so what is needed here is to check on what's been returned and get them sent off to the company by the deadline. Then when the gifts arrive back, arrange for distribution.
- **Disco Team** We normally run these in January/Feb time and then again in the summer term. We're well versed in the organisation/set up so again it's one that would be relatively easy to pick up and only happens twice in the academic year.
- **PTA Newsletter** every week we write an entry for the school newsletter. We send it into the school office by Thursday lunchtime. If you were on the committee to hear what's going on and needs to go in, could you pick up responsibility for writing the newsletter?
- **Christmas Concerts/nativities** we normally sell refreshments at each of the school performances in the build up to Christmas. They are all in the morning so perhaps would suit someone with a later starting time for work, a full time parent or someone who can do flexi-time. There is very minimal organisation and it's just a couple of hours on each day (you don't have to make them all and can reach out to the wider community of parents for helping on the day)
- Sign Up Genius we currently use this for parent helpers to sign up to events. This is currently always set up by our Chair and we've created templates for most events now anyway. Could you be in charge of creating the sign up genius for each event (if others gave you the details/requirements). This might suit someone who can't be at events in person but wants to help.

We try to have some fun along the way and in the past, we've had groups of friends take on an event - last year we had the Disco Team and it worked really well. The above are really just a starter for ten for all the different ways you could help and you can see that we can divide a lot of it down into bitesize chunks.

#### Attendance

As you are aware The Department for Education has issued new statutory guidance for attendance called *Working Together to Improve School Attendance* which came into effect on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024. It includes some important changes and outlines what schools, parents and Local Authorities should do to improve pupils' attendance at school.

#### **Requests for Absence**

Requests for absence should be made by parents in line with the school's Attendance Policy. This will be in written form with the date of the proposed absence and as much detail as possible about the reason for the absence. As is currently the case, Headteachers may still only authorise absence that they consider to be an unavoidable and exceptional circumstance. The school will reply to parents to advise them whether the absence will be authorised or not.
