

Reading Newsletter Summer Term






Spotlight on.... Isabel Thomas









Join Danny and Dino on a superhero-filled adventure as they try and save the city from a supervillain called DESTRUCTO!




Join a plucky little penguin on the journey of a lifetime, in this fabulous new picture book from superstar author and illustrator Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler.



Summer Reading Challenge!

The Challenge Will officially begin on the 20th July

Children can sign up at their local library from 13th July. They can read whichever library books they like and there are 6 special stickers to collect, one for each week of the summer holidays. Everyone who finishes the challenge will receive a certificate and medal!

There are two ways you can take part in the Summer Reading Challenge:

You can join at <u>your local library</u> and take part in person. The librarian will give you a collector folder, stickers, and other special rewards, and help you find books to read.

Or, take part online by signing up at: https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk/join-in Set a reading goal and log your books on your profile. When you reach your goal you will unlock a virtual badge and certificate.

Please note, the in-person and online Challenges are separate. Physical incentives like medals and certificates are only available via the library, for those taking part in the in-person Challenge. The Summer Reading Challenge, presented by The Reading Agency, is delivered in partnership with public libraries and funded by Arts Council England.

The Challenge encourages children aged 4 to 11 to enjoy the benefits of reading for pleasure over the summer holidays, providing lots of fun as well as helping to prevent the summer reading 'dip'. Each year the Challenge motivates over 700,000 children to keep reading to build their skills and confidence.


