Sign Design Time!

We are currently updating our Travel Plan and parking around the school has been identified as an issue. We are therefore being invited take part in a competition that the Local Authority is running for schools. The Road Safety Team are running the competition to promote active travel and responsible parking around schools and are asking our pupils to design posters to reflect the issues around our school. The winning designs will be made into signs and banners for the school to display outside in the railings to ensure that the message goes home. When designing the posters encourage the children to think about what it's like when they are dropped off and picked up at school, what the potential



dangers are and how it could be safer.

The designs need to be back by 24th April. The posters should be clear, simple, and bright (not lots of little pencil drawings) with child's name and class on the back. More details are on the poster being sent home today.
